Other Information:




Winter Gear: Please do not bring in snowpants and boots unless we request it. As long as the temperature allows, when there is

Improving Skills: A

great way to improve many skills at the same time is to have Family Game Night once a

week. Board games always strengthen patience, team work, taking turns and sharing. They also often strengthen counting, letter recognition or color recognition.



Expectations: Raise the bar for your preschoolers. They are not so little

anymore (as much as we want to hold onto that so badly as parents). They are capable of doing many things for themselves. They are starting to be able to understand feelings also. Empathy for others, treating people the way they would like to be treated, respecting adults (including parents), just to name a few. The younger they learn these skills and qualities the easier the lesson is.

it's not "just play"

Play is an essential part of early learning.
It is the lifeblood of the learning process.

As children play they are developing the cognitive, socio-emotional and physical skills they will need to take them into a successful adulthood.

They are developing their curiosity, problem solving, intentionality, flexibility, and verbal & non verbal skills.

Socio–emotionally they are developing their emotional intelligence – learning confidence, cooperation, negotiation, sharing, empathy and how to communicate appropriately.

Physically their fine motor and gross motor skills are being practised and developed.
